Aid for Ukraine

The disaster in the Ukraine leaves us desperate to help. JOY has contacts with the local Ukrainian community and the means to get aid to Poland.

We are asking for the following items (**NOT clothes** which are being provided by communities across the country)

Toiletries, towels, facecloths and sanitary products, first aid kits, new underwear and socks, baby milk, flasks and sleeping bags, warm hats, scarves and gloves (it's snowing there with temperatures well below freezing).

All must be new or as new, and can be left at the Shipley JOY shop on Thursdays between 10am and 3pm or the warehouse at 14 Jubilee Way on Thursdays between 10am and 1pm or in church. Please contact Kathy on 07751303210 for any bulk donations, so they can be collected swiftly.

Be assured this will not delay or reduce our aid to the Yemen (See further notice below.) Thank you. Help in sorting and packing will be gratefully accepted.

Churchwarden news

Hazel Wilmshurst will be stepping down as Churchwarden at the Annual Parish Meeting this year. So we all need to be thinking and praying now for a successor to Hazel before nominations open at the start of April. Is this something you could do? Or something you could encourage someone else to consider seriously? The Staff would be very pleased to talk to you informally about it. We will be thanking Hazel formally for her time in the role at the Annual Meeting. We will also have a total of 8 vacancies on the Parochial Church Council to fill at the annual meeting – please be praying about whether God be calling you, or someone you know, to this important role.

Annual Parochial Meeting and Electoral Roll

This year's APCM will be on **Sunday May 1st**. To vote in this meeting you need to be on the Electoral Roll of the church. Most of you who worship regularly here are already on the Roll, but if you have begun to attend since the start of the Covid pandemic you may need to join. You have until the end of March to fill in the relevant form, and Elisabeth Sture will be supervising this and making the essential checks.

Ways to support Messy Church

Thank you for your ongoing support! Messy Church continues to be a brilliant outreach, especially to families who wouldn't normally attend church including See and Know families. We get to form friendships with them through the social elements of Messy Church, as well as tell them about Jesus. We still need help though, so these are various ways in which you can support:

- 1) Eat Yogurts!: at Messy Easter we're making mini easter gardens which need yogurt pots that have an additional little corner pot attached to the main pots (such as Muller corners and mix in sweeties yogurt pots). There will be a box for the collection of these in the general office. We need them by Sunday 3rd April please. Enjoy having an excuse to eat these sorts of yogurts!!
- **2) Build:** Easter is of course a super exciting time to remember Jesus' victory and so we're trying to make Messy Easter as memorable and special as possible! We would ideally like to have a big wooden tomb and stone built for this event and it'll be a prop that we can continue to use at various Easter services and events for years to come! If interested in help build it, please speak to Rachel or Jessica Criddle asap.
- **3) Preparations Team**: we have a planning team and a preparations team that meet monthly. If interested in helping with either of these behind the scenes please get in touch with Rachel for more information.

- 4) On the day help: Messy Church is from 3.30-6pm (including tea) on the third Sunday of every month. However between 12-12.30pm after the 11am services, Rachel needs help with set up. Other volunteers are needed to do jobs including registering; doing the tea trolley; kitchen team; supervising an activity table; simply chatting to families; reading a story (we'll supply the story); leading prayers (we'll supply the ideas); laptop; sound desk; tidying and washing up. Times to arrive and leave depend on how you decide to help so you don't necessarily have to stay the whole time. More helpers would be good for both March Messy Church and Messy Easter but particularly for Messy Easter which might be a bigger event and will include some drama if you're interested in that too as another option for helping! - **5) Invite!** Upcoming dates are the 20th March and Messy Easter on the 10th April. Both are 3.30-6pm including tea with fun for all the family!
- **6) Pray!** Pray however you feel led but some prayer suggestions include for wisdom for preparations, for the services themselves and also for the spiritual impacts of Messy Church!

Mission Partner News

We are continuing to get regular updates on Ukraine from Sheila Leech and the International Team at FEBA. You can follow these easily at www.feba.org.uk. Most of their radio stations are in the west of Ukraine and are still broadcasting - but the conflict in Ukraine is deeply troubling and fast-changing. Poverty, family breakdown and unrest are already issues familiar to this generation of Ukrainians. FEBA's partners are reaching out to a population who have lived through two generations of Christian suppression and persecution under the Soviet occupation: they are sharing the uniquely good news of a loving God who is transforming lives in an area not always welcoming of the gospel message. Evacuations and attacks across the country since the war broke out on 24th February have had a direct impact on the team. Despite these challenges, they continue to broadcast and reach out to listeners in this extraordinarily difficult time. As they follow up with terrified listeners through phone calls and messages using social media, the team are sharing scripture on air and offering hope in the midst of conflict. Many fearful hearts are melting and are opening to the love of Jesus. Pray for the safety of FEBA's partners in Ukraine; also that Sheila, currently based in the UK, may be able to visit us later in the year.

Julian and Catherine Shelton anticipate a busy year ahead in Bible translation. Their annual report has been sent to us. If you would like a copy of this to inform your prayers for the Sheltons, you can request one from John Rainer.

Give thanks for **Garry Ion**'s recent visit to us and pray for his current work with the Men in Sheds project in the Diocese of Carlisle.

Remember the work of **our local charities**, JOY, BEACON, the Zephaniah Trust, Shipley Neighbours and the Bradford North Food Bank.
