Yemen

I feel this quote from our friends in Yemen underlines the desperate need there. Today, out of every 100 people in Yemen, 70 have almost nothing to eat. 66 have no access to health care. 58 are without clean water. 15 are severely malnourished. None have faith in Christ. While Yemen's local churches have reported unprecedented growth since the nation's war broke out in 2015, their numbers remain far short of statistical significance in a nation of 30.5 million people facing physical and spiritual desperation 4 million people have been uprooted by the 7 year war, and things are expected to worsen in the coming months, due to soaring food and fuel prices stemming from Russia's war in Ukraine as well as underfunded aid programs. In spite of a 2 ½ month cease fire over 7,000 more desperate people have left home seeking jobs and food. We aim to send as much food as we can afford as well as medical supplies in our next container in a couple of months. Continue to pray for the tiny, faithful church there. Your prayer and support is much appreciated. Kathy

Ukraine

Medical staff are desperate for:

Bandages, dressings, cotton wool, catheters, stoma dressings. Dates are no problem as customs are waving them through.

Vitamins, paracetamol etc (NO prescription drugs!) calcium, iron, folic acid, wheelchairs, walking frames, NEW newborn clothes pasta, rice, tins of meat, feminine pads, tablet soap (not liquid- bottles split in transit and let's save on plastic!!) toothbrushes and paste, towels, blankets. Mission Partner News

We have received the following urgent prayer request from Ian and Simea Meldrum in Brazil.

Dear Friends

We have been experiencing exceptional heavy rains here in Brazil that are causing major problems for our communities, work and families. The rains have caused extreme flooding, displacing people from their homes and causing deaths throughout communities. To date in the greater Recife/Olinda area 189 people have lost their lives, due to the flooding and mudslides. Many homes have been destroyed as it continues to rain as I write this.

During the last fortnight our normal program has had to be suspended as the team is working full out on the front line, with much-needed help from some of the larger churches (one of the positive results has been to see how the different churches have united and are sharing resources). For those who have lost everything, we have been distributing clothes, cleaning, and hygiene materials, and most importantly an average of 300 cooked meals daily, to those who have lost the ability to cook for themselves There is still a big need for mattresses for

those whose homes have been flooded and furniture destroyed. Please unite with us in your prayers for this community and the effects that are being felt from this extreme weather and for our work to be able to continue in supporting them.

Please also continue to pray for Sudan as our appeal draws to a close, and for our preparations for a visit from FEBA, including Sheila Leech, in July.
