Mission Partner News

St John and Ellie Perry

Pray for St John who has flown back to Sabah this week : Ellie is not with him on this occasion but is waiting for a trip next year which will probably include St John's ordination. The first step is teaching *Family Ministry* at the Sabah Theological Seminary. This course includes marriage counselling and is for final year students, run in Malay. Pray for safety in travel, smooth immigration, quick recovery from jet lag, and effective communication over this crucial course run just weeks before graduation.

Regarding ordination: the aim now is for StJohn to prepare the ground locally with the Anglican Diocese of Rochester in November, ahead of ordination in Sabah in January. This timing allows for a pre-ordination retreat and for joining clergy training afterwards.

Pakistan

Whilst we have no formal Mission Partner links with Pakistan, please pray for the country as it continues to face serious flooding. This has been forced off the news by events in the UK. Tear Fund is one of the charities involved in flood relief.
