


ST. PETER'S

# News from Brazil (My Father's House)

#### Ian and Simea Medrum write:-

Here in Brazil, we are finally fully underway with our program for 2023, after the long summer school holidays in Jan/ Feb and then the Carnival disruptions, so let me tell you our plans for this year. First and foremost, we continue our work to catch up with the children at the children's better-paid schools. This is supplemented with the very popular Jujitsu classes, Bible study, and recreation. This now happens in three different "Favelas" with a fourth about to start, enabling us to reach out to 150 children and teens. Many of them come with the attitude that "we were born poor, live poor, and will remain poor in adult life." To change this and create a new vision for the future of each child, is not easy but with God's help we have seen many lives changed and trust to continue to do so as they are introduced to local churches.

As I write this we are once again in Brazil experiencing heavy rains and flooding of many homes, so our emergency action is underway, distributing extra food parcels. Due to the heavy bad weather, we are at the moment having to replace our kitchen roof!

New this year is a series of courses being offered to the mothers of our children! The first of which is a course on the "Care. of the elderly" This 120-day course as well as enabling families to offer better care of elderly relatives will also offer a professional qualification to provide employment opportunities in an area much in demand. These courses will take place at night, and on weekends so as not to disrupt the children's program. This new work has become possible because My Father's House is well-regarded by the authorities and after more than a year of negotiations and red tape are being financed by the state government.

Join us in praying for the following things.

The floods and the detrimental damage they are leaving behind: Pray that the project will be able to source the relevant funds to repair the roof, as well as to support the emergency efforts and food parcels they are giving out.

The adult courses funded by the local council: Pray that they will have a positive impact and be an effective tool for change.

My Father's House Team: Pray for them as a group and as individuals as they face new challenges in the ever developing work. Also pray for their mental health and wellbeing, this type of work can be physically and mentally draining and it's important they are able to be in good mental health themselves.

The floods and winter weather: Please pray for the protection from the bad rainfall for the vulnerable families we work with.

Please do continue to pray for the new church of St John, Muscat. Pray particularly for the various items which need attention to allow the church to operate fully: the pastoral/flock tending, administrative and financial items which underpin the work of every church all need setting up from scratch.
