Safeguarding report to APCM April 2023

The Parish of St Peter's Shipley takes our collective responsibility for safeguarding those most vulnerable in our community seriously. Safeguarding policy is the responsibility of the PCC and appears as an item on every PCC agenda.

All policies in relation to Safeguarding children and Vulnerable adults used in the Parish are those of the Diocese of Leeds and Church of England. Details of these are displayed on the main noticeboards at the entry to church.

Safeguarding training at most levels is now available online via the Diocesan website. The Vicar and PCC appreciate the diligence of those who have undertaken this in a timely manner demonstrating their understanding of the importance of safeguarding as a collective responsibility.

It is our hope in the coming months that DBS and Safer Recruitment administration can be greatly accelerated with the introduction of Microsoft 365 in the Church Office.

The Church of England has launched the **Parish Dashboard**, which is a tool to help us easily identify who needs what training. This is in the process of being updated, so anyone who completes training must let the PSO know.
