The Land & Buildings Sub-Group was set up as a sub-committee of the PCC little over two years ago, to works with the staff team in planning and maintaining church property and finding ways of increasing revenue from its buildings. Hive Tenancy

The fixed-term 12-month tenancy of Hive is due to end at the end of summer. While the refurbishment of their building - Kirkgate Centre, has made good progress, final fitting out might take a little longer. Therefore, we are looking to enter a periodic monthly tenancy with them to give

them the extra time they might need that would also give us the time to advertise and backfill the space they vacate.

Fernhill Land

After a couple of ad hoc meetings in summer 22 and 23, some time was spent meeting with each group who use Fernhill – St Peters Bowls Club, Tennis Club, and the Scouts – to understand more about their clubs and needs. One of the requirements of the Eco Church programme is to have a Land Management Plan for any land owned by the church that takes into account the Environment, Community and Heritage. Some initial work has been done to map the site, some of its wildlife/planting and facilities. As a result, a 'Fernhill group' was established in February, (currently facilitated by Jackie Loach) reporting into the Buildings and Land Subcommittee of the PCC and aims to meet 3 times a year. The purpose of this is to facilitate a coordinated approach to the sustainable management of the church site at Fernhill and enable the Church and the users – Bowls Club, Scouts, and Tennis Club - to communicate well and work effectively together to manage the site for the benefit of users, the church and wildlife both now and into the future. As well as representation from each of the organisations and Church leadership team, we have had input from Glyn Levis and Hugh Firman, church members with expertise in wildlife and managing land for community and environmental benefit. There is a huge amount of voluntary effort that is undertaken by each group to look after the different parts of Fernhill which provides a wonderful community asset - and the group identified some priorities to work together on as people's time and resources allow -including holding an Open morning to enable Church members, neighbours, and others to come and see & enjoy it.
