This weeks reflections from Rev Natasha Thomas



Dear Friends,

I wonder what our feelings are as we watch the events of murder, destruction and hatred. As we see people charged up with hatred and anger against those they believe are not like them? They believe have taken something from them or prevented others from getting something? That they are living in the UK illegally with benefits? I don't know. It is hard for me to understand. But what I do see is real anger, and that stems from something that is building a momentum of hatred against others the total antithesis to what it means for us as Christians.

Because love is central to all that we are. We know and understand, that due to God's grace we are forgiven and be loved. Not by being or doing anything special.

I've been trying to understand what brings people to such points of hatred and so was really interested to hear a young man on the radio, sharing how he had got caught up in becoming part of a far right group, that he came across during lock down. Everything he learnt about was based on a negative, until he became a Christian and realised that his hatred of others, was not based on his personal experience, but rather on words and false truths that made him feel he needed to fight for justice...but his indignation was not built on a reality. One day he found himself in church and got chatting to the vicar, and realised that actually, God was the one who could provide the answers that he was looking for, and that the injustice that he thought he was fighting was not based on love. It was built on hate. He had wanted to find a way to change things. His heart was good, but he needed to put the emphasis on love instead of hate.

Daily morning prayer has been taking us through Samuel and the feuding between David and King Saul. And I am beginning to find some resonance in Saul's response to someone from whom he feels threatened. Saul had begun to fear David as he was excelling in all that he did. He is overcome with jealousy and paranoia and he loses perspective. He loses his sense of his responsibilities and has no concern for others. He has no conscience as he determines to exterminate David. His heart we are told is hardened against David and is prepared to go to extreme lengths of murder and cruelty to try and get to him.

David on the other hand finds himself in the wilderness and yet we do not see him become self pitying (which perhaps would've been my response!), but instead we see his heart set on depending on God and trying to walk with integrity with Him.

As we watch the crowds on our screens becoming hardened as they try to attack those they believe are their enemies stopping at nothing including the police in order to destroy. I wonder how have their hearts become hardened to no longer seeing others as people...we need to watch that our hearts do not become hardened or brittle and insensitive to the needs of others. If God is to use us, we need to allow ourselves to be moulded and shaped by our circumstances. God promises to walk with us whatever difficulties surround us. But hardness of heart is never a strength, but always a refusal to learn.
