I am beginning to feel that little bit of excitement, as we begin our count down towards Christmas morning, tinged with a little of anxiety as I go over my 'To do' lists and plans for the different services that will be taking place over the coming weeks as we look to rejoice together, pray together and tell others about the amazing news that Jesus came as a baby into the very mess and chaos of our earth.



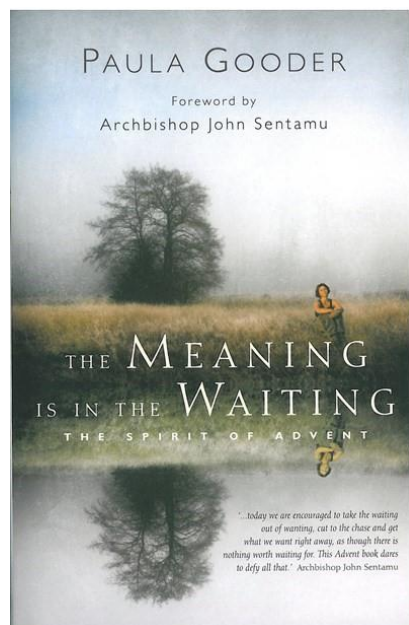

Advent Recommended daily reads...and post Christmas Booklets



Daily Readings and Reflections for Advent...

This is the first in a series of books commissioned in consultation with John Sentamu. It can be described as "The Archbishop of York's Advent book". Its theme is overtly an Advent one, yet subsequent books will range over other biblical and seasonal topics.

Paula Gooder provides a profoundly biblical guide to the season of Advent and we explore its central theme of waiting (something we are not good at in our modern culture) in the company of the biblical characters who feature prominently in the lectionary readings for the season:

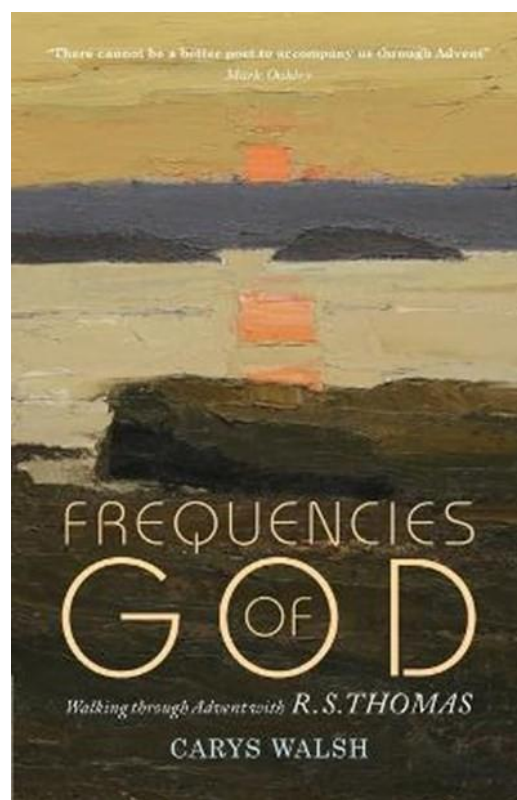
Abraham and Sarah who waited for a child, Isaiah and the prophets who waited for judgement and redemption, John the Baptist whose role was to wait in the wilderness until the prophecies he foretold were realised, Mary whose waiting began in pregnancy and continued as she stood at the foot of the cross.

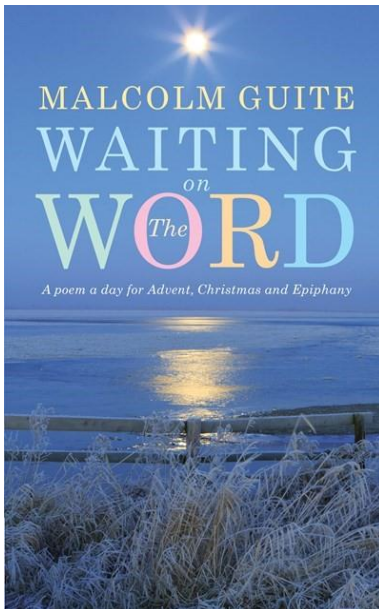
Arranged for daily reading, this offers an exquisite meditation on the spirituality of waiting - the active doing of nothing - as a way of enhancing our lives and bringing us closer to God.

With the season of Advent, the coming of Christ is imminent, and following the contours of the season leads through a rich time of preparation for God-with-us in the Incarnation.

R. S. Thomas, a poet of waiting and anticipation, can be a profound guide for this season. His spiritual and poetic trajectory of discovering the presence of God - divine 'frequencies' - even in apparent absence, can help lead us into an Advent landscape of surrender, open-hearted discovery, epiphany and encounter.

This collection of 28 reflections on Thomas's poetry travels through the season, and follows one of the traditional patterns of themes explored in each Sunday of Advent: a Carmelite pattern of waiting, accepting, journeying and birthing.



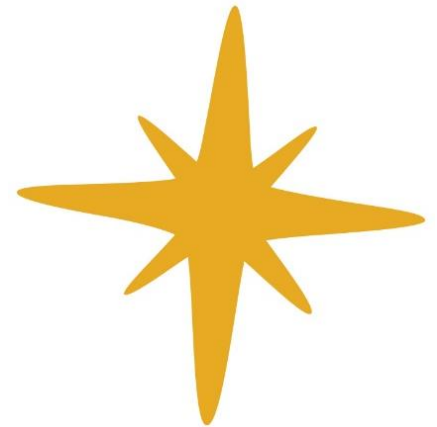


Advent is a season of waiting and anticipation in which the waiting itself is strangely rich and fulfilling. Poetry can help us fathom the depths of Advent's many paradoxes: dark and light, emptiness and fulfilment, ancient and ever new. For every day from Advent Sunday to Christmas Day and beyond, the bestselling poet Malcolm Guite chooses a favourite poem from across the Christian spiritual and English literary traditions and offers incisive seasonal reflections on it. In the spirit of the season, he blends the familiar and the new, ranging from spiritual classics such as Edmund Spenser, John Donne, George Herbert and Christina Rossetti, to contemporary voices Luci Shaw and Scott Cairns. His own acclaimed sequence of sonnets for the great Advent antiphons are also included.

There are lots of great local businesses locally, including environmentally friendly ones such as <https://hedgehogorganics.co.uk/> in Bingley

It might be a quieter time of year for gardeners, but now can be a great time to think about installing a water butt - or several - to collect water, which you can use to water plants with in summer, or considering other eco-friendly garden additions such as bird boxes, or a bug hotel.

If you're getting Christmas gifts, consider second-hand options, and items with less packaging and plastic, or give an alternative Christmas gift to benefit others, for example, <https://charity-gifts.christianaid.org.uk/>

As we celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas, we can also give thanks that God created our world, our environment, and everything in creation is held together in Christ.
