THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

Be a Martha about becoming a Mary - Joseph Buthee

In Luke 10:38-42, Martha, the devoted host, bustles about her home, pouring her heart into preparing meals and ensuring every detail is perfect for her guests. Her tireless efforts, though admirable, leave her frazzled, while Mary, at first glance, seems sluggish, sitting at Jesus' feet. With a loud huff and puff, Martha urges Jesus to nudge Mary into helping. He pierces "Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken from her." Mary had found the pearl of his presence. *Selah*.

My 16-year-old self, always hunting for a holy excuse to dodge chores, loved to use this passage! But Jesus isn't praising idleness; He's calling us to prioritise his presence.

In our frenetic 21st-century lives, we're juggling chaos, battling through the school queue to drop little Elijah, dodging the barrage of Mum chat, sprinting for the 7:42am train to Leeds, then navigating a blizzard of emails and deadlines in a hectic office. How can we be 'Marys' amidst this? Can we be Mary's whilst serving in the 'Arthur and Martha's' rota?

This is an issue not unique to this century, nobility would travel from all over to watch a 17th-century pot washer who found God while scrubbing dishes amongst the clamour of a working kitchen, Brother Lawrence; "In the noise and clatter of my kitchen," he wrote, "I possess God in as great tranquillity as if I were upon my knees at the Blessed Sacrament." His secret? Embracing Mary's heart within a Martha's to-do list.

Many tick "Christian" on diversity forms these days with little commitment to the title, Jesus used a different title, a higher call; disciple. Perhaps the word apprentice is more suited to our modern ears, less a noun than a verb. The New Testament uses "disciple" 269 times and "Christian" only three. Discipleship demands effort. It sounds a bit Martha, right? Yet, what if the one place we're called to be like Martha is in our pursuit of becoming like Mary? A.W. Tozer urges, "Set the direction of your hearts towards Jesus" these days we struggle not to set direction of our eyes to our iPhone; is it possible to disciple and rewire our gaze to meet his Love? To abide (live) in the vine.

Loving God with all our heart, soul and strength seems daunting, but it is the greatest pursuit...and command (Deuteronomy 6:5). A treasure worth everything, like Mary's captivated love, a pearl so precious we'd sell all to possess it. The one place we're called to "strive" is to "enter His rest" (Hebrews 4:11). So, pause... regularly. "Be still... Know Him" (Psalm 46:10) 'know' =yada, a Hebrew word for knowing deeply, intimately, experientially; Experience him. The mark of true discipleship is to be with him, praying without ceasing, glancing throughout the day, finding Mary's heart in our Martha world.
