## THIS WEEK'S THEME

Isaiah 6:8

## THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

This is guite a hard passage to hear, to understand and respond to. How many of us can say that we will put God before our family in order to follow Him? In this passage, Jesus uses strong language to emphasize the seriousness of following Him. He speaks about the need to prioritize faith above all earthly relationships and personal comforts. He highlights that commitment to Him requires a readiness to take up one's cross and follow Him, which symbolizes a willingness to endure hardships for the sake of faith. The call to discipleship is not just a casual invitation but a lifechanging commitment of utmost importance. We don't often want to hear about this side of discipleship. I know I don't but Jesus is clear.

If we accept who He is, and want to receive His grace we need to challenge ourselves bit by bit as to how we remove the idols in our lives that take us away from being dependent on God. I have been really taken with the sense that we are to be regularly disrupted from our comforts, our security, routine so that we are putting God first. When Jesus mentions "hating" one's family, He is emphasizing the need for radical devotion to Him. This does not mean we should literally hate our family members, but rather that our love for Him should be greater than our love for anyone else, even those closest to us. It reflects an understanding that discipleship demands a heart fully devoted to following Christ, even in the face of personal sacrifice or societal rejection.

#### The Cost of Being a Disciple

Large crowds were traveling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: "If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sistersyes, even their own life-such a person cannot be my disciple. And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

Luke 14:25-27



To be a Christian is to love God with all our heart, mind and soul. To put His calling on us above other needs because we know and understand what He has done for us.

The joy of knowing what God has done for us and finding ourselves accepted and loved for who we are, is the starting point to becoming more like our teacher - Jesus Christ. By trusting in Him, we can give so much more than perhaps we even expect from ourselves because we understand what it means to be loved. It means we can start to respond to God as Isaiah did by saying 'Here I am. Send me".

Throughout September we are going to be reflecting on what it is we can give in order to serve God and how we intentionally together are building God's kingdom here on earth. Rev Natasha Thomas
