What are we storing on earth?

THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

As we continue to think about giving, we have this passage from Luke, that tells us not to be afraid, because God our Father has promised to give us the Kingdom. We are to trust in Him and His generosity so much so that we can be generous with all that we have. It is interesting that I was having a conversation about the roots of socialism and the influence on the state... whether we should pay more or less taxes, whether we trust our politicians... and it reminded of a time when I heard Tom Holland (historian and author) speak at a conference. He described how he came to the conclusion that when writing about the ancient Roman and Greek cultures, he was struck fundamentally by the change of heart that came. They as nations had celebrated brutal mass murder and genocide. No thought to sacrificing children or keeping slaves, and then through the figure of Christ things changed. Only because of Jesus on the cross, Holland argues, has victimhood come to be seen as something that must be respected and, where possible, rectified. The brokenness of Jesus's body on behalf of the victimized had paved the way for the marginalized and the oppressed to be treated with dignity and honour.

Jesus, followed by his disciples throughout the ages, are the driving force to generosity and giving. A profound way that has shaped our western culture - He says that as people living in the West, we have no idea how Christian we are, because of the morality that came as a result of Christ's personal sacrifice.

As Christians, we are called to follow Jesus' sacrificial example. We are to give what we have to others. To share what we have, so that we can bring the kingdom to earth and delight in God as we trust his ongoing provision to us.

So I pray that you will be generous in your giving to the church, particularly this Harvest time and Gift Day, where we are asking for £30,000 so that we can continue to employ Joseph, our youth and family worker, and mission and outreach to our community. His report of actions in this last year, showing how he is bringing fruit to our church, is available on request.

Parish Giving Scheme

Please consider giving through the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS). This system allows you to donate money to the church by direct debit which gives you a lot of protection. You can give: online; email; telephone or by letter. If using online you can adjust your giving as often as you want. Donations are requested on 1st of the month and paid to us on or before the 10th. If you pay tax, register for Gift Aid. There are numerous advantages to the church as it reduces the number of transactions we have to reconcile, helps us with cashflow, encourages regular review of giving and reduces the burden of gift aid claiming.
