
Giving

THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

How we give and how much we give are in fact two very different things as Paul highlights to his churches. I can just hear them moaning - okay we will give you what you are asking for, and you want us to be happy about it - you don't ask for much do you?!' but I hope you see that they are missing the point. What Paul wants us to understand is that our giving is directly in response to the love and generosity of God. That we are to give what we can, delighting in being able to give.

Knowing how much to give is a tough question that we need to ask God's help for discernment with and that we need to grapple with, because none of us are the same. But the clear message that Jesus gives is that it is meant to challenge us. Disrupt us enough to know and feel that we are giving something away to God, for God. Jesus is very clear in His parable of the widow who gives her last 2 coins, compared to others who give large sums of which barely scratches the surface of what they earn - she is the one Jesus says who will be honoured. So even if we feel we cannot give much in time or money, we are to give what we can. Again Jesus tells us in his parable of the mustard seed, that this tiny seed can actually become something so significant as to provide shade and rest to many birds. A blessing to all those who need it's comfort. Can you do something that will make a difference to others?

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each one should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not out of regret or compulsion. For God loves a cheerful giver.

Parish Giving Scheme

Please consider giving through the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS). This system allows you to donate money to the church by direct debit which gives you a lot of protection. You can give: online; email; telephone or by letter. If using online you can adjust your giving as often as you want. Donations are requested on 1st of the month and paid to us on or before the 10th. If you pay tax, register for Gift Aid. There are numerous advantages to the church as it reduces the number of transactions we have to reconcile, helps us with cashflow, encourages regular review of giving and reduces the burden of gift aid claiming.
