Practicing the Way: Witness

James 2: 14-26

THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

You are my witnesses

A witness is someone who saw something happen. Someone with a special expertise because they were there. But anyone who has ever had to talk to lots of different witnesses to the same event will tell you that all their stories differ slightly. They all notice different things. Interpret what is happening differently. As witnesses, we're the same. We all have our own views from our own angles of the same story of God's work saving his world. We all have our own tale to tell about the difference that knowing Jesus makes to us.

Throughout his life, Jesus talks to people about his Father God – his power and his love and his plan to save them. His last command to his disciples on earth was to go and do the same about him – as he is taken up to heaven in Acts chapter 1, he says to his disciples: "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth." He's talking to us too. His apprentices here and now. Our job too is to tell others the good news about Jesus – be witnesses to what we've seen him do.

But how do we do it? Go buy a sandwich board proclaiming 'Repent!' and stand on the corner outside Waterstones in Bradford and shout at passers by that Jesus saves? It's true, but shouting at random strangers isn't going to get us very far. People will hurry by, pretending to talk to someone on their mobiles, hoping not to catch our eye. I know I would....

The Bible tells us what matters is what we do, not just what we say. The things other people see in us that shout witness to the spirit of God in us. "Let your light shine before others," Jesus says in Matthew 5 "that they may see your good deeds and glorify your God in heaven." Yes we need to be ready to talk about where our hope comes from, how we can keep going when things seem impossible, the healing and peace and purpose Jesus brings to our lives. But the things we do need to attract people to us first, make them want to find out what it is that makes us treat others the way we do, why we behave in a way that's counter cultural.

Our witnessing most easily starts with "Do you fancy a coffee and a chat?" "Would you like to come round for supper?" - not just to our friends but to everyone - most of all to the last, the least and lost. When we open our homes and our lives, our light starts to shine. When we counter hostility with hospitality, people see the things we do and they start to wonder why. What we do is where our witness starts – actions that make others curious about us. Because curious people ask questions. Questions that will open doors for us to tell our stories of witness.
