## THIS WEEK'S THEME

**Practicing the Way** ~ Scripture ~ Psalm 119 and John 1:1-5

THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION
I wonder how many of us really consider the Bible as a 'holy' book - as the words that have been inspired by God. I am always impressed by our Muslim brothers and sisters who really revere the Koran - not even letting it be put on the floor, with only certain people being able to read non-translated versions... perhaps a bit too exclusive. But it does make me stop and think how we value our scriptures and whether from time to time we take it for granted. That we can just pick it up when we fancy - or perhaps not bother to pick it up at all. One of the beautiful stories that is shared on Alpha, is how a couple of Iranian women risk their lives to distribute Bibles in Iran. They describe how after they had distributed 1000's of Bibles to people's post-boxes that they were arrested and yet persevered in their faith until they were released and given asylum. Then one day they were so blessed when giving a talk in Australia a couple came to them in tears, to say that they had found one of those Bibles and because of that they had found faith.

Reading the Bible transformed them. Transformed everything about how they saw the world and wanted to live in the world. Those women risked everything for others to read the word of God, and God used His word to inspire and transform more lives.

Our challenge this week, as we review our practises in following Christ is to think about how we approach reading our Bible. Do we see it as

but I have not strayed from your precepts.



an opportunity for God to talk to us. An opportunity for our lives to bechanged, because we learn more about who God is and His love for us. Do we approach reading the Bible with anticipation of learning as to how by reading these 'living' words we can be inspired to find hope, love, joy and peace that is beyond this world.

Reading the Bible can be hard work, and it can feel daunting because it is so large and some of it feels very alien and removed from today's way of life. And some of it doesn't make much sense. This is where reading the Bible together really helps our understanding and the different perspectives, allowing the spirit to inspire and help us. I so encourage you to consider joining one of our Fellowship/Home groups as an opportunity to discuss particular Bible passages. There are also many resources that can help us to read and understand the word of God, such as the Bible-Project that produces wonderful YouTube videos on all of the books in the Bible, which give an understanding about the overall arch of a book and its context and what themes might be running through. There are also so many daily reading apps such as Lectio 365, Pray on the Go, Daily Bread that give reflections and questions to ponder. I so want to encourage everyone to try and read the Bible each day - giving God the chance to speak into your life in a way that can Rev Natasha Thomas be life-changing.
