THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

We have reached the end of exploring the Christian practices as outlined by John Mark Comer in his book Practicing the Way, and the final practice is to consider how 'Serving' others helps us to apprentice Jesus better. Jesus throughout his life points that the way we are to live is love our neighbours, to serve as He served. To pick up our cross, sacrificing our needs for the sake of others. His way is to serve, rather than to be served.

This does not sound very simple or straightforward. I know it can lead me to feel guilty at not 'doing' or serving those in need. But as I prepared for this Sunday it began to dawn on me, that our service comes out of our love for God. Our service comes out because we are loving God, and therefore want to love those we meet in our daily lives.

When we look at Jesus and where He demonstrates service, it is at the dinner table, it is at a well, at market places, on the way to somewhere else - just ordinary places. These acts of service are incorporated into His daily life, they are not specifically dedicated times. They are at times points of interruption, where He stops what He is doing and responds to the need in front of Him.

One of the challenges then as we think about service, is recognising that we do not have to start a new voluntary activity (Which I would so encourage

you to do as it can be the most wonderful and fulfilling role), but to consider what we can do for those people that we meet in the street, or for people who are already in our daily lives. People who need a bit of extra care, like a lonely neighbour, the Big Issue seller outside the Co-op, a frustrated mum whose toddler is in a melt down... who ever they are there might be something that you can do to make their life that little bit better. The thing about serving others is to do it with a joyful heart. To give our time and effort without expecting anything back. Jesus gave His time and His love to washing His friends really dirty, dusty feet. They had to let their Rabbi, their leader touch their calloused feet with tenderness and care. It must have been so moving. He wanted these men to understand that to lead and teach in His way means getting on your hands and knees to care for those around you. That the heart of service has to also stem from humility.

Humility that acknowledges that no matter who you are, you can help make a difference by giving care and love to another person, this might mean taking a meal round to someone you know who is feeling a bit poorly, offering to carry someone's shopping when they look over-loaded, offering to go for a coffee when you know someone needs a listening ear. To be in service is to acknowledge that you do not have to be special to do these things, and that anyone can do them. So why not you? I so hope that these practices have been a source of challenge and that you continue to consider how you can be a better apprentice in following Jesus.
