THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

This week I am being reminded very much of the fragility of life in and amongst the busyness of preparing for Christmas, the extra services, the pastoral visits, the creaking of boilers and dishwashers!

Christmas rightly focuses on the joy that comes when a new baby is born, but for some it is a hard time because things are not what they should be according to the world. A bereavement, an argument, a broken relationship and silence between friends and family. A world where there is still war between Ukraine and Russia, in Sudan, in Gaza where men and women are being killed daily. Life can feel so dark and difficult.

And this was the case when Isaiah pronounced these words of hope to the Israelites. That the waiting for a new king - a Messiah, is not in vain. That out of the hurt, the brokeness and the pain there is hope. A shoot will come out of something that is believed to be dead and brings the hope for change.

And that is the joy that comes from knowing our Lord and Saviour is coming to this earth. It is to acknowledge that we currently live in a time of

(Isaiah 11:1-3)

brokenness. A time of chaos and hurt, but to know that God came to save us through sending a baby, who was born in the dirt and mess of an outhouse. So fragile. Mary and Joseph must have been very concerned and confused. They knew this baby was special - God had told them so, so how come the beginning of his life was so hard?

It does seem strange, but then I suppose life on earth is hard. It is full of challenges and struggles, and our Lord came not as a great King - although he had all the angels to call on if he needed. Rather he chose to come and live a life of hardship. I love this poem The Coming by RS Thomas, which for me says it all about God's amazing love.

The Coming....

And God held in his hand A small globe. Look he said. The son looked. Far off, As through water, he saw A scorched land of fierce Colour. The light burned There; crusted buildings Cast their shadows: a bright Serpent, a river Uncoiled itself, radiant

With slime.

On a bare
Hill a bare tree saddened
The sky. Many People
Held out their thin arms
To it, as though waiting
For a vanished April
To return to its crossed
Boughs. The son watched
Them. Let me go there, he said.
