# THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

I think this passage is my favourite this year. It really taught me something about what Jesus means about his kingdom. I have always been a political person, looking to ways in which justice can be brought about through a political response - challenging those we perceive as in the wrong as the prophets did and John the Baptist did... (I still believe this!) But there is a challenge in this passage because Jesus' behaviour was to challenge those in authority through love and action. He still proclaimed judgement, but His focus was on being with the poor. His focus was not on the systems of life, rather it was beyond that, looking to ways that bring life to all people for eternity. John the Baptist (Jesus' cousin) was struggling to understand why Jesus was not challenging the hierarchy. But John's focus was only to consider what was necessary for earthly deliverance and so "When John, who was in prison, heard about the deeds of the Messiah, he sent his disciples to ask him, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?" (John 3) Was Jesus not who he said he was? The disappointment that John feels is clear. Perhaps we too feel this disappointment? Why doesn't God intervene?

Jesus replied, "Go back and report to John what you hear and see: 5 The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy[a] are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor. 6 Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me.

Matthew 11: 4-6

Jesus, who declares John as the greatest prophet, responds to John and describes what is happening because of what he is doing. Lives are being changed. Transformed. And the good news is reaching all people - including the excluded such as the beggars and the lepers. Life for people who felt that they had no hope, now have hope. The prophecies of old are being fulfilled. This is what Jesus came to do. He came to save all people for eternity, not for a time and a place. Not just for one community. His short time on earth was to set an example for how we are to follow him.

Despite the greatness of John, Jesus reminds us that we are in a more privileged position. As believing Christians, we have our place in the Kingdom of God! Amazing Grace. John understood that he was to prepare the way for the Saviour, and that he must become less as the Saviour becomes greater. But I wonder whether he had ever realised that his sacrifice was to be imprisoned and finally executed at the whim of a dancing girl? Do we recognise the sacrifices that perhaps we need to make in following Christ?

It can be so hard for us to step back, to make way for another. Jesus gave his life bringing the good news of life and hope. This good news is always about transformation, about community, about belonging and including. Not being exclusive. Rev Malcolm emailed his delight that at their new toy give away at Christchurch, 120 families in Windhill were helped, fewer loan sharks will be used to buy things. Toys at Christmas does not bring about transformation, but they do bring about a relationship between church and community. It brings about the opportunity to demonstrate that as people who follow Jesus, we offer generosity and love to all people, even people who feel that they are the least. How can we share this love with our neighbours? Our community? How do we share the hope we have?
